### 2023 Year in Review

Giving Grace celebrated and implemented the merger between Grace Like Rain and Giving Hope accomplished in the prior year. Our team has streamlined the process of guiding clients from homelessness to long-term housing and stability, witnessing numerous stories of hope along the way. Our dedicated team of intake volunteers are committed to ensuring that every person seeking help feels cared for and connected to all available resources.

Individuals experiencing literal homelessness are directed to our exceptional Street Outreach team, which identifies and assesses their needs. Street Outreach then refers participants to available internal resources or community partners.

The Housing and Readiness Team works diligently to link participants with housing options, including Emergency Shelter for families, Permanent Supportive Housing for those experiencing chronic homelessness, and Tenant-Based Rental Assistance for those in need of rental support for housing stability.

We integrated the Rise With Grace Case Management program across all Housing and Readiness programs. This program consists of a three-phase readiness program and a seven-phase, up-to-two-year program addressing resource needs such as housing, transportation, childcare, mental health, life skills, and community support. The implementation of Rise With Grace aims to contribute to the long-term stability of our participants.


